RE: Use of Funds

Pursuant to Act 2014-314, the Alabama State Department of Education intends to use the \$118,088.11 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 distributions from the Penny Trust Fund for the areas of high-risk public school disease categories affecting students throughout our school systems.

The funds will be allocated to those school systems and schools where the greatest number of students exhibiting these high-risk disease categories are enrolled. The prevention efforts and supplies will be disseminated through the local school nurse who oversees the individual health plan for students.
